

PROTECTED TREES – MEMORIAL & COMMEMORATIVE

1. Village Hall Lot – south exit in memory of Jean Harvey.
2. Pioneer Park – center, east side near path, maple in memory of Carl Mullis.
3. Reid Park – south of gazebo near parking lot and sidewalk to Chuck's, ginkgo in memory of Ruth Gaylord Black.
4. Reid Park – north of gazebo toward lake, locust in memory of Thel Madsen Shoberg.
5. Reid Park – memorial grove between gazebo and marine building, 11 memorial trees planted in memory of Jean Whowell by Gordy, Gene Small by Trudy Small, Teddy Millar by the Millar Family, Jimmy Fogt by Audrey and Family, Jim Madsen by Thel Madsen Shoberg, Fred P "Budd" Shoberg by Thel Shoberg, and Don and Marvis Sheldon by the Sheldon Family. Other four are not recorded.
6. Reid Park – Maple tree adjacent to Chuck's Tavern in memory of D.J. Barr.
7. Lakeview (Triangle) Park – south near parking lot curb, Red Sunset Maple in memory of Elmer E Benz.
8. Lakeview (Triangle) Park – White Weeping Cherry in memory of Russell Jacobsen and Douglas Jacobsen.
9. Lakeview (Triangle) Park – center bed around monument, 4 weeping trees (katsura, white pine, two others) in memory of September 11, 2001.
10. St Benedict Catholic Church – south bed by entrance, crab in memory of Jane J. Hubertz.
11. Municipal Beach – along fence, north of gate, locust in memory of Jane Barr.
