Monthly Meeting of the Public Works Committee
Friday September 20, 2019 @ 3:00 PM

Trustee John O'Neill called the public works committee meeting to order at 3:00 Friday, September 20, 2019.

General Business

Approve Minutes for July 26, 2019

Kennedy/Ceschi 2nd made a MOTION to approve the minutes for the July 26, 2019 meeting, and the MOTION carried without negative vote.

Duck Pond Dump Site Concerns

The committee discussed concerns with non-residents and contractors dumping yard waste up at Duck Pond, which is only for Village residents. The committee discussed installing signage with an imposed fine for non-Village residents using the dump site. The committee also discussed installing a box with a log book for residents to write down their address for verification of being a Village resident. Day stated he would order new signage and Loomer would look into the Village ordinance on dumping at Duck Pond.

2020 Landscaping and Boulevard Maintenance Contracts

The committee discussed concerns with the contracts with Clearview Landscaping and Roy Diblik and asked for clarification on which company takes care of which areas throughout the Village. Loomer, Day, and the Park Commission, are going to get together to review the contracts to clarify who is responsible for Village landscaping areas.

South Lakeshore Drive Stormwater Concept Plan

Day discussed the concept plan from Village engineer Terry Tavera on two areas of South Lakeshore Stormwater Drainage. The first area is Glenwood Springs. Tavera proposed three options: the first option is to run the stormwater down S. Lakeshore Dr. and discharge on the little beach; the second and third options are to run stormwater through Glenwood Springs private property in two different locations. Day stated that Tavera recommended the first option to run the stormwater completely on Village property and discharge it on the small beach. The second drainage area considered is Club Unique. There are two options and the first is to discharge the stormwater into the creek that currently is used for stormwater. The second option is to install a stormwater

pipe through Club Unique and discharge the stormwater into the lake. This option would also include the drainage of the pond on Indian Hills Road. Day stated that Tavera recommended the option of installing a stormwater pipe through Club Unique. Kennedy/Ceschi 2nd made the MOTION to recommend Village Board approval on Village Engineer Terry Tavera recommendations on the S. Lakeshore Drive Stormwater concept plan to run a stormwater pipe down S. Lakeshore Drive and discharge the water on the Small Beach and install a stormwater pipe through Club Unique, and provide a cost comparison between the different options discussed. The MOTION carried without negative vote.

Abbey Resort Drainage Concerns at Loading Dock

Reschke discussed the concerns of the flooding that occurs at the loading dock with the heavy rains we have received. The two pumps that they use can't keep up with the rain and it floods their loading dock and basement. Day stated that if the Village installed two stormwater inlets at the entrance of the loading dock that should alleviate the issue. There is Village stormwater pipe at the entrance of the loading dock, but there are no catch basins to catch any water, which is why the loading dock floods. There is one catch basin inlet near the loading dock entrance, but it can not handle the flows of water we receive. Ceschi/Kennedy 2nd made the MOTION to recommend Village Board approval on installing two stormwater inlets at the entrance of Abbey Resort loading dock, and having the costs presented at the next Village Board meeting. The MOTION carried without negative vote.

Discuss Stormwater Utility Options

Loomer and Day asked the committee if they would be interested in revisiting the concept of creating a stormwater utility. The concept was presented about ten years ago but ultimately voted down, but with the heavy rains over the past few years staff felt it might be an appropriate time to take another look at how it might benefit the community.

Set Next Meeting Date

The next meeting date was set for Friday, October 25, 2019 at 3:00 pm.

Adjournment

Trustee O'Neill/Ceschi 2nd made a MOTION to adjourn the meeting at 3:37 pm, and the MOTION carried without negative vote.
